TIPS

- 1-3 recommendation letters needed (three letters of recommendation from college professors of professional colleagues who are familiar with your academic record.)
- Bold your strength
- How you met (Courses, your research professors ...)
- Professors need to submit recommendations directly in portal or email it.
- Professors that study abroad and have great publications (high rank)
- Formal & Friendly
- Grammer
- Don't lie
- Try not to copy
