LOGICAL CHAIN OR WHY? (MULTIPLE WHY)

Why is Z good? connect it to a Z' and Z''!
Sometimes reverse chain is possible (Result of (stem from) / Result in (lead in))

An increase in interest rates



Raises the cost of repayments on variable rate mortgages



Leading to a fall in effective disposable income and consumption



Which may cause the output gap to become negative



Leading to a possible fall in inflation

- Why is having space program a good thing?
 - Reason: It makes people feel proud of their country
 - Why does the space program make people feel proud of their country?
 - Reason: It shows technical skill
 - Why do people care about technical skill?
 - Reason: It shows development of a nation
 - Why is developing a nation important?
 - Reason: It helps make the nation more politically and economically secure
 - And so on...
 - Link Back: That's why nations prefer to make progress in space programs.

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IF/THEN STATEMENTS

Example:

If people spend their time constantly "plugged in" to their cell phones, then it will diminish the quality of connections they have. For instance, if a person cannot stop thinking of the latest sports scores or whether they got a "like" on a photo they just posted, then the level of engagement they have with a real-life human being suffers.

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ANTICIPATE THE OBJECTION (REBUTTAL)

Anticipate the objection or rebuttal is a technique in which a speaker or writer uses argument, and presents reasoning or evidence intended to undermine or weaken the claim of an opponent. A rebuttal is when you respond directly to your opponent's argument/point to explain/show how/why they are wrong. Counterargument: attack their claim! IT IS BETTER YOU USE THIS STRATEGY IN ONLY ONE OF THE PARAGRAPHS

Example:

While many may argue that not all forms of social media are bad and that social media does have advantages, from being able to keep in touch with far-away friends and family to venting your thoughts at three o'clock in the morning, they overlook something important. There is a cost to such convenient connections: we are less likely to reach out to those who matter most.

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CONCESSION POINT

Example:

True, not all forms of social media harm our ability to function in social contexts. Indeed, one could argue that many conflicts that might become more contentious 15in a face-to-face scenario would be better hashed out16 with a smiley-face and a "like." But for the most part, social media can eat away at17 the fabric 18 of our most intimate bonds.

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KIND OF LINK BACK

There are some methods of structuring paragraphs in the body

- TEAL Topic sentence, Evidence, Analysis, Link to the question
- MEAL Main idea, Evidence, Analysis, Link (Thompson Writing Program n.d.)
- PEAL Point, Evidence, Analysis, Link (Gibb 2016)
- PEEL Point, Explanation, Evidence, Link (Matthew Flinders Anglican College n.d.)
- Link: to finish the paragraph off, you need to link the point you've just made back to your essay
 question, topic, or thesis.

PEEL EXAMPLE

- Point: Parents should not allow their children to watch violent TV shows as it causes them to be more violent.
- Evidence: When children see a lot of violence on TV, they start to think it is normal and copy the
 aggressive behavior.
- Explanation: An experiment at Pennsylvania State University showed that pre-school children who
 watched violent TV shows were far more likely to hit and argue with other children than pre-schoolers
 who did not watch these shows.
- Link back: Clearly, parents should not allow their children to see violence on television as it makes
 young people more L aggressive.
